

IMPACT AREAS

Karachi United (KU) is committed to building healthy, happy, and sustainable communities in Pakistan using sports as a development tool.

In the past 12 months, KU's **12 Community Centers** have served as engagement hubs, providing training to over **1,000** young players aged **between 4-25** years in football and life skills free of cost. Critically commonplace in impoverished areas, this helps take these children off the streets and away from society's vices (gangs, drugs, petty crime). Additionally, KU works with community stakeholders to help form a bond of healthy, active, and inclusive communities driven by the ideals of sport and sportsmanship.

All 12 centers are strategically located in economically disadvantaged areas, ensuring that players have access and exposure to engage in KU initiatives that they otherwise would not have access to. In addition to receiving football coaching, all players at Karachi United undergo life skills classes designed to enhance their confidence, communication, and leadership qualities aimed at their holistic development.

Moreover, Karachi United has fostered partnerships with organizations, such as **Standard Chartered**, **Engro**, **Common Goal**, **IRD Global**, **and other local organizations** focusing on promoting community mobilization, gender equality, reducing inequalities, and advancing other areas related to the **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)**.





EDUCATION EXCELLENCE AND LIFE SKILLS DEVELOPMENT: EMPOWERING THROUGH FOOTBALL









Karachi United is committed to the holistic development of its players. In addition to regular coaching and tactical football training, life skills sessions play a pivotal role in fostering all-around player growth. Over the past 12 months, Karachi United has intensified its focus on three critical areas: **confidence, communication, and leadership skills**. KU conducts **three weekly sessions**, each lasting **30 minutes**, facilitated by dedicated life skills trainers and experts.

The majority of players enrolled in all 12 community centers at KU come from underprivileged communities and attend public schools where access to quality education is limited. Consequently, these life skills sessions serve as a bridge, addressing the gap in players' skill development, which ultimately enhances their on-pitch performance and also makes them into more confident, empathetic individuals equipped to face life's challenges with resilience and leadership.

Karachi United places a special focus on increasing women's participation in football.

Recognizing that sports continue to be less accessible to women in many parts of Pakistan, KU is dedicated to breaking these barriers and providing women with coaching, mentorship, and opportunities to excel in the world of athletics, fostering a culture of equality and female empowerment in the realm of sports.



The majority of women engaged with Karachi United come from areas like **Lyari**, **Orangi Town**, **Manghopir**, and Gulshan, where women's participation in activities has traditionally been limited. Through KU Centers, these women receive training, breaking down barriers and offering opportunities for active participation, particularly in sports. Karachi United is playing a pivotal role in promoting inclusivity and gender equality in these communities.

Life Skills Sessions

Karachi United, in partnership with Legal Aid Society, provided free football training and life skills coaching to 48 young prisoners at the **Central Jail, Youthful Offenders (YOIS) Industrial School Karach**i. Many of these juveniles were released in 3-6 months. Karachi United has also taken initiatives to enroll the released youngsters in their Community Centers to engage in productive sports and help them become engaged members of the community.

The activities included:

- Provision of football training and coaching to juvenile prisoners
- Encouraging engagement of juveniles in external football clubs upon release

The **5-month** project included football coaching that aimed to boost the confidence and self-esteem of juveniles by adopting a **restorative** and **rehabilitative** approach.

Karachi United engaged Head Coach Abdul Waheed and Asst. Coach Muhammad Hussain. Both of these coaches have expertise in coaching disadvantaged communities and come with several years of playing and coaching experience.

After the conclusion, Karachi United engaged Juvilenes in Football matches with Karachi United Old Golimar and Moin Star. These matches allowed Juveniles to participate in healthy competitions and reflect their hard work, dedication, and merit, irrespective of their juvenile background

Collaboration with IRD Global

Karachi United partnered with IRD Global to set up a medical camp at the Orangi Town Community Center to provide basic health diagnoses, especially for **Tuberculosis**, to over **100 women** and **children**. The camp also aimed to raise health and hygiene awareness, empowering young athletes and their families to proactively safeguard their health.



Collaboration with Karachi Down Syndrome Program

Karachi United partnered with the Karachi Down Syndrome Program to promote **mental well-being**, raise awareness of Down Syndrome, and normalize sports for **differently-abled** people. KU organized an awareness session and a friendly match involving **50** KU players and **50 children** with **Down Syndrome** to showcase the power of sports to unite people and promote inclusivity.



Collaboration with Indus Hospital

Karachi United partnered with the Indus Hospital for the "Voice Against Tobacco" project, training 40 young athletes to prioritize their well-being and promote healthier living in their community by advocating against tobacco use. As a result, these athletes have become champions of health and fitness, promoting a tobacco-free future in communities.



EMPOWERING THROUGH SKILLS

Karachi United empowers marginalized youth to break the cycle of generational poverty through tailored football training and life skills development. By providing avenues for sports engagement and exposure to inter-school competitions, KU broadens horizons and instills aspirations for a brighter future. KU's emphasis on coach development ensures a sustainable approach to poverty alleviation within the community. These coaches become catalysts for empowerment, breaking the generational cycle of poverty and transforming into productive contributors to society.



Train the Trainer

Karachi United (KU) has taken a unique approach to youth development, working with Liverpool Football Club (LFC) to train coaches and athletes in the sport. In 2020, KU sent 12 coaches to Dubai for a three-day training program led by LFC. The goal? To empower young people in communities by creating employment opportunities and instilling life skills through football. Since then, KU has trained over 100 athletes and worked with other football organizations like Right to Play to expand this initiative to Quetta and Islamabad.

TTT covers five areas of player development: tactical, technical, social, mental, and physical skills. Through the Train the Trainer program, KU coaches have elevated their skills and knowledge, allowing the program's syllabus and coaching methodology to be seamlessly integrated across all their Community Centers, ensuring that the quality of coaching remains consistently high.

ESTABLISHED 12TH COMMUNITY CENTER - MANGHOPHIR, KARACHI






In March 2023, Karachi United opened the **12th** community center located in Manghopir, Karachi, specifically designed to cater to the needs of the **Hazara community**, who are considered a minority in Pakistan and often lack access to such opportunities.

By integrating members of the Hazara community into the center alongside other ethnic groups, such as Baloch, Sindhi, Pathan, and Punjabi, the center aims to promote **cultural exchange** and encourage interaction among diverse communities of Karachi. This helps foster unity and understanding among players sharing different races, religions, and ethnicities to coexist peacefully.

The center offers sessions designed to the Hazara engage and empower providing opportunities community, personal growth and skill development. The center works to reduce inequalities and create inclusive communities through the promotion of football and life skills education.







UNPARALLELED PLATFORMS

STANDARD CHARTERED KARACHI UNITED YOUTH FOOTBALL LEAGUE



Karachi United collaborated with Standard Chartered Pakistan for the fifth **Youth Football League**, continuing a five-year legacy of community engagement. The three-month program brought together more than **1,000** young footballers, providing them with opportunities to improve their skills and participate in the competition. This event was part of an ongoing effort to encourage boys and girls to thrive through sports, engaging around 5,000 youngsters in leagues annually over the past five years.

KU has conducted five leagues in Karachi and one in Islamabad, uniting young people from diverse communities through sports. This shared platform offers an excellent opportunity for youth to enhance their skills engage in constructive activities. especially youngsters who do not attend schools and belong to neglected communities. The event features categories of U10s, U12s, U14s, U16s for boys and a special category for Girls and Schools.

ACADEMY TOURS TO QATAR ACADEMY



The Karachi United Academy team visited Aspire Academy on invitation for a friendly bilateral and tri-series. Karachi United Academy has an impeccable record at Aspire Academy, where it has consistently won against Aspire Academy – Qatar, Fenerbahce FC – Turkey by good margins, among other teams.

Karachi United values its relationship with Aspire Academy and has visited seven times for a friendly series. The trip gave KU teams an opportunity to train at fully equipped facilities and play on world-class pitches. Taking on teams from international sports academies was a far-fetched dream for some players who struggle to eat three nutritious meals a day.

This year the visiting squad comprised of under-11 and under-12 teams that played three matches each, trained at the Academy's facilities, watched a match in the local football league, and returned home with their hearts filled with hope for a future in the sport.













UNPARALLELED PLATFORMS

KARACHI UNITED SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIP



Karachi United School Championship once again featured 40 top school teams in Karachi vying for the right to be called the best school football team. KUSC is one of the core events staged by the club for the promotion of football at the grassroots. It serves as a forum not only for schools to showcase their combined talent but also an event from which clubs, such as KU, look to shortlist quality talent.

Set up in 2005 with the objective of providing a forum for students to play competitively in a safe and professional environment while putting the onus on schools to invest in their football program, KUSC provides a platform for students to showcase their skills and allows the opportunity to nurture and harness the best football talent at the school level. The competition has 4 categories: Senior Boys, Senior Girls, Junior Boys, and Junior Girls.

Zayyan, and Murad, Academy players at Karachi United, have also enrolled at **Kiran Foundation's DCTO campus**. Through KU's collaboration with Kiran Foundation, players from marginalized communities receive quality education and essential skills.

These exceptional footballers earned an extraordinary opportunity: a fully sponsored 5-day orientation at Cadet College Jhang, thanks to **Next-Gen Impact's Community Engagement & Service Programme**. This initiative aims to immerse underprivileged children in discipline, academics, and sportsmanship.

Zayyan and Murad found their passion at KU and are now headed to Jhang for a transformative experience, backed by the collaboration between Karachi United and Kiran Foundation. This partnership highlights the importance of education in sports and showcases how such collaborations positively impact communities. Next-Gen Impact's initiative emphasizes the power of sports in instilling discipline and academic excellence among marginalized youth.

Eschal and Yaseen's passion for football started many years ago at Karachi United, where they began honing their skills and abilities as players. They represented Karachi United in various national tournaments while working hard to improve their game. Following their involvement in the Standard Chartered KU Youth League, they also started transitioned into coaching in their community.

In February 2023, they received a life-changing opportunity to attend a coaching workshop at the Liverpool Football Academy. During this workshop, LFC shared its best practices for coaching children of different ages, abilities, and environments.

They are now replicating their approach to coaching players in Pakistan, making a positive impact in their community.







YOUTH MENTORSHIP INTIATIVE

KU has always been at the forefront of promoting sports and encouraging young athletes to excel in their respective fields. One of their key focus areas is youth mentorship, especially for women. KU understands that young girls face several barriers when it comes to pursuing sports as a career. The lack of exposure, limited opportunities, and societal pressure often discourage them from following their passion

To address these challenges, KU conducts mentorship sessions to provide young female athletes with the guidance and exposure they need to succeed in sports.

The last mentorship session engaged 50 female footballers who were passionate to make a mark in football and explore football and coaching as a career.

These mentorship sessions were conducted by Karachi United footballers who have been engaged with the organization as part of women's football team and have also represented KU at national and global forefront.

The impact of such mentorship sessions is immense. It provides young girls with the necessary exposure to the sport and helps them break down barriers and challenges they may face. Additionally, having role models who have represented the country on a national level inspires young girls to work harder and pursue their dreams with more determination.

GRASSROOT DEVELOPMENT

Open Youth Tournament

Karachi United successfully organized the 27th edition of the Open Youth Tournament, engaging over 80 teams. The three-day quarterly event allows young footballers to showcase their skills and passion for the sport. The tournament is open to all youngsters from different academic institutions, football organizations, and community organizations to participate and engage in friendly competitions.

With age-specific categories catering to players under 11, under 14, under 17, and under 20, the tournament ensures accessibility for all young individuals between 8 and 20 years old. This inclusivity fosters a nurturing environment where talent knows no bounds, allowing every participant to shine regardless of age.

At its core, the tournament's primary objective is to ignite and nurture youth involvement in football while striving to cultivate a more conducive and supportive football culture within Pakistan.

Pakistan Tour

Karachi United recently took its Under 16 and Under 18 youth teams to Islamabad to play football against diverse teams and represent Pakistan. All of the participants were young athletes who had trained throughout the year, mostly school and college students aged between 15 and 18 years old.




